

## Business Interruption

In relation to Clause 15 of the Terms and Conditions (Parent Contract), under the School's business interruption insurance policy, Tudor Hall School and Carrdus School may refund school fees if the school is forced to close in one of the following circumstances related to notifiable diseases and health risks:

- i) any occurrence of a Notifiable Disease at the premises or attributable to food or drink supplied from the premises
- ii) any discovery of an organism at the premises likely to result in the occurrence of a Notifiable Disease
- iii) any discovery of a Notifiable Disease within 10 miles radius of the premises
- iv) the discovery of vermin or pests at the premises
- v) any accident causing defects in the drains or other sanitary arrangements at the premises

'Notifiable Disease' means an illness sustained by any person resulting from:

- i) food or drink poisoning
- ii) one of the following specified human infectious or human contagious diseases an outbreak of which the competent local authority has stipulated will be notified to them.
